



Our Vestry is comprised of lay leaders elected by the members of the Church. The Rector is a non-voting member. The Vestry meets regularly to discern our vision and mission, and to make decisions for the Church corporation. The Vestry enlists lay members to help in its duties, and to carry out the ministry of the laity as outlined in

the Catechism (BCP, 855): “The ministry of lay persons is to represent Christ and his Church; to bear witness to him wherever they may be; and, according to the gifts given them, to carry on Christ’s work of reconciliation in the world; and to take their place in the life, worship, and governance of the Church.”

**LEGEND**

 Rector’s canonical duties include liturgy and music in worship, spiritual formation, Christian education, and building use. The Rector hires and manages staff within the annual payroll provided by Vestry.

 Vestry’s canonical duties include management of Church property and providing the Rector with an annual payroll for staff. Vestry has legal and fiduciary duties to act for the Church corporation.

 Responsibility for many of our ministries are not specified by canon law. We undertake these together as shared ministries among clergy and laity.

 Our by-laws provide that “The Vestry may create such committees or commissions, standing or special, to perform such functions as specified by Vestry resolution.”
